North Country	A new half-high blueberry which has shown itself to be very hardy, vigorous and productive. Mature plants reach 2 ft. in height, 30-40 inches in diameter, and yields 3-7 lbs of fruit. Nanking Cherry	6-10' same broad dense highly ornamental shrub, becoming open and attractively irregular. Pink buds open to masses of fragrant white 3/4" flowers. Deeply veined light green foliage with very fine fuzz (tomentosa) lining each vein underneath. Very tasty but variable tart scarlet 1/2" fruit for pies and jams. Two or three berries will provide your vitamin C for the day. Excellent hedge plant; prefers full sun in well-drained soil. This is an edible landscape crop that produces a lot of fruit that actually is edible. Covering the plants with netting will deter the birds from stealing your crop. Wentworth High Bush Cranberry	8-12' Also known as Crampbark. Mult-stemmed shrub, good for screens and hedges, has clusters of whit flowers in May. Pendulous clusters of brilliant red orange berries hang September-February and are still edible off the bush in mid winter. Berries make jams and preserves, also are popular with dozens of bird species, especially wax wings. Flowers help attract and support beneficial insects. Bark is used as anti-spasmodic; tea especially good for relieving menstrual cramping. Wentworth was selected for edibility and large fruit size in the early 1900's from a collection of 3000 viburnums. It also features bright lime-green leaves and red fall foliage. Tolerates dry soils if high in organic matter, but prefers rich moist well drained soils, sun or shade. Soil pH 6-7. pollution tolerant. Susceptible to viburnum leaf beetle; check with your local extension office or nursery to determine if this could be a problem. This is not a bog cranberry. Native from Canada to NY. Regent Juneberry	<p>4-6' also called Western Serviceberry. Saskatoon or Shadbush. J Candrian introduction Regent, ND. Compact shrub form with fragrant white flowers in early spring and large 1/3"-1/2" blueberry-like sweet purplish berries in July sweeter than blueberries. Berries are good in pies and jams, fresh or dried. Used by native people in western prairies to make pemmican. Also popular with wildlife. Nice red-orange fall color. Regent was selected for excellent foliage and berry production. Generally considered the best ornamental cultivar. Prefers slightly acid soil, pH5-7. thrives as well along stream beds as it does on rocky slopes. Tolerates partial shade, salt, pollution and wet spots but not standing water.
